



CART PLACEMENT

Garbage and recycling carts will be picked up at the curb. Be sure to keep the carts at least 4 feet away from each other, and also 4 feet away from the mailbox, basketball hoops and telephone poles. Cart wheels face away from the road.



SET-OUT TIME

Please set out your carts by 6 A.M. on your service day. Your collection time may vary due to weather conditions, traffic delays, or other issues.



HOLIDAYS

Our office and operations are closed for the following holidays:

- · New Year's Day
- Thanksgiving
- Christmas

If your scheduled curbside pickup falls on or after a holiday during the week, your garbage and recycling will be delayed one day for the remainder of the week. See calendar on page 9 or online.

SECURING YOUR TRASH

During high winds and winter storms, we recommend you set out your carts in the morning. If you use bungee cords to secure your carts on your service day, please let us know as an additional fee applies.



CURBSIDE SERVICE LEVELS

We offer three sizes of trash cart: 35, 65, and 95 gallon carts. We also offer curbside and valet service. You can set your service frequency to weekly, every other week, or once a month service.





DRIVEWAY CLEARANCE

If we need to drive in to service your carts, the driveway must be trimmed and maintained at a minimum of 14' in height and 14' in width. Please be sure to take into consideration that our trucks are as heavy as a fire truck, and 3 of them will be driving up and down your driveway depending on the level of service. This will cause additional wear and tear on the driveway, which we are not responsible for repairing. We don't drive over private bridges or roads that can't support the weight of a truck. Additional fees apply for drive-in service.



ENCLOSURES & GATES

Carts must be visible from the truck and cannot be up any steps or on a raised porch. If the cart is behind a fence, the fence must be open and the driver must have direct access to carts without having to walk long distances. The enclosure must be easily accessible so carts can be wheeled out, and we cannot lift or pull carts out of an enclosure. Additional fees apply.



EXTRA TRASH

If you have extra trash that will not fit inside your garbage cart, please give us a call the day before your service day to let us know that there will be additional bags beside your cart to pick up. This trash must be bagged and bags must be secured or tied, and not so heavy that our drivers cannot pick them up or that they break/split open. If you have extra recycling, please call our office before setting it at the curb. Additional fees apply.



STINKY CARTS

Does your cart smell awful? Well, you're not alone. Are you bagging all your waste items? Have you tried using cleaners in your cart? If nothing works, give us a call and we can help. For a fee, we will replace your carts on your service day.



ON-CALL PICKUP

On-call pickup is suggested for residents who do not live locally year-round. We leave the carts at your residence and when you're planning on being in our community, please call or email us when you want us to empty the carts. A minimum monthly fee applies and the carts are left at the residence year round.



MISSED PICKUPS

Did we skip your house or did you forget to put your trash out in time? Please give us a call and we can discuss your options. *Additional fees may apply.*



SERVICE DELAYS

Collection may be delayed due to inclement weather, mechanical issues, or driver shortage. Most of the time, we ask folks to put their carts out at the curb and leave them out. We will be by to collect them as soon as we can.



NEW LOCATION

Our new Toledo office is now open at 380 NW 1st Street. Please make your check or credit card payments at this location. Note that no cash is accepted at this location (cash payments may be made at the Transfer Station).

After years of working out of mobile trailers, in 2024 we opened our new office on 1st Street in Toledo.





MEDICAL WASTE/SHARPS

For a fee, we will provide you a sharps container and proper disposal of the filled container. Stop by one of our community offices to pick up a Medical Waste/Sharps container. Oregon DEQ defines sharps as "needles, IV tubing with needles attached, scalpel blades, lancets, glass tubes, and syringes out of their original sterile containers". This waste cannot be put in your trash!

According to Oregon State law, sharps must be stored in an approved biohazard container. Milk jugs and coffee cans are not safe or acceptable forms of sharps storage!



FLUORESCENT TUBES & CFLS

Light tubes and Compact Fluorescent Light bulbs can be disposed at the Transfer Station for a fee per foot/bulb. Please keep these items out of your trash or recycling! Light tube ballasts are not accepted and should be brought to the next Household Household Hazardous Waste Event (Please see page 15 for additional information).



BULKY ITEMS: YOU CALL, WE HAUL!

We pick up appliances, mattresses, couches, televisions, and even bagged or boxed trash. Give us a call and we will schedule a pickup for the next time our driver is in your area. This may or may not be on your regular service day. If the item is over 50 lbs or cannot be lifted by one person, we will need to send a second helper at an additional charge. No stairs, no pianos, no loose trash, and no piles of brush. Additional fees apply.



SCHOOLS

We offer a variety of services to our schools, including classroom visits, tours of our transfer stations, and Touch-A-Truck appearances. We also offer free consulting services to schools, which include everything from waste audits to advising staff on best practices for collecting materials inside the school buildings.

FIRE RISK

Please **do not** put the following items in your trash or recycling due to the risk of starting a fire: lithium batteries, hot ashes, chemicals, fireworks or ammunition. Lithium batteries come in standard sizes, but are also found in rechargeable power tools, e-scooters, and similar devices. If these batteries get damaged, they can start a fire that is very difficult to extinguish. Batteries of all types can be dropped off at the Transfer Stations, and chemicals should be brought to the next Household Hazardous Waste event (see p. 15 for details). Call us with any specific questions.



WHY RECYCLE?

Recycling...

- Saves water, energy, and other natural resources like trees, minerals, natural gas, and oil.
- Makes for good stewardship and helps protect our environment for future generations.
- Reduces the amount of waste sent to landfills.
- Prevents pollution by reducing the need to collect new raw materials, which helps reduce your carbon footprint.
- · Helps create jobs in recycling and manufacturing.
- May help lower your garbage bill by allowing you to switch to a smaller cart or less frequent service.

WASTE REDUCTION & REUSE

These 'R's are more powerful than recycling! Buying less stuff and reusing materials save natural resources, energy and reduces emissions from the production and transport of new goods. Here are some Waste Reduction and Reuse tips:

- Carry a reusable water bottle and refill it often!
- Take your own mug to the coffee shop.
- Carry canvas bags when grocery shopping.
- Buy loose fruits and vegetables.
- Use reusable containers for storing food and packing lunches.
- Refuse single-use plastics when possible.
- Buy in bulk to eliminate packaging.
- Shop at stores that re-sell clothing, furniture, appliances, and tools.
- Use cloth napkins instead of paper ones.
- Try to repair broken items before replacing them.

MIXED COMPOSTABLES - NOW IN YOUR YARD DEBRIS CART!

Curbside compostables collection is available for all Dahl residential customers. Accepted materials include; **all food** (fruit and vegetables, meats, bones, grains, beans, cheese, and eggshells), **food-soiled paper** (napkins, paper towels, tea bags, coffee grounds/filters, and sawdust), and **yard debris** (grass, leaves, branches, flowers, weeds, and yard trimmings). **NO** pet waste, restroom products, flatware, plates, or cups (even if it says compostable!).

To help combat odors, mess and critters, consider using a paper bag to hold messy items, or freezing your food waste and placing it in your cart on the morning of your collection day.

HOME COMPOSTING

Composting your yard trimmings and kitchen scraps is a great way to help your plants and reduce the amount of waste you generate.

To start a home composting system:

- Build or buy a compost bin, or just make a pile.
- Mix two parts greens (grass, leaves, and flowers) to one part browns (dry leaves, sticks, and twigs).
- Some kitchen scraps are acceptable (vegetable and fruit peels, eggshells, coffee grounds). No meat or dairy products—these can attract rodents and flies and cause bad odors.
- Turn and water regularly; keep your pile moist (like a damp sponge), and move the material around using a pitchfork or shovel.

WHY USE COMPOST?

Compost increases water retention, decreases the need for chemical fertilizers and pesticides, and helps keep a useful resource from going to waste. Diverting material from your garbage cart may allow you to reduce your garbage collection frequency or the size of your garbage cart, which can lower your cost of service.

These items can go into your Black Cart with the Green Lid

ALL FOOD

Fruits, vegetables, meat, poultry, seafood, bones, grains, beans, pasta, cheese, and eggshells

FOOD-SOILED PAPER

Napkins, paper towels, tea bags, coffee grounds/ filters, wooden crates, sawdust

PLANTS

Floral trimmings, tree trimmings, leaves, grass, brush, weeds

TODA COMIDA

Frutas, verduras, carnes, mariscos, pescados, huesos, granos, frijoles, pastas, pan, queso, cáscaras de huevo

PAPEL MANCHADO POR COMIDA

Servilletas, toallas de papel, filtros y residuos de cafe, bolsas de té, cajas de madera, aserrin

PLANTAS

Ecortes de flores y árboles, hojas, césped cortado, malezas, hierbas

- Styrofoam®
- Bottles and cans.
- Aluminum foil
- Liquids


CURBSIDE RECYCLING

At Dahl Disposal Service, we are committed to recycling efforts and are asking our customers and clients to please "Keep it Clean" and only place items that are found on the recycling guide in the cart. If you are in doubt please find out by calling us, using our app, or visiting our website. Top contaminants include:

- Glass Bottles and jars collected separately at our transfer stations
- Electronics collected separately at our transfer stations
- Plastic Bags can be taken back to some local grocery stores
- Other Plastics cups, plates, flatware, clamshells, takeout containers, coffee pods, and diapers go in the garbage
- Shredded Paper Ask us about our confidential shredding options

KEEP IT CLEANWhen in doubt - Find out





PLASTIC RINSE FIRST. Plastic BOTTLES & JUGS that have a neck smaller than the base. No other plastics please!

TIN & ALUMINUM CANS RINSE FIRST. Tin & Aluminum cans, aluminum foil, pie pans, metal lids, & empty aerosol cans (do not puncture or remove nozzle)



PAPER/CARDBOARD Flattened cardboard, junk mail, magazines, flyers, office paper, envelopes, paper bags, newspaper, paperboard, phone books/paperback books. Place loose papers in a paper bag or cereal box.

RECYCLING CONTAMINATION

China and other export markets have imposed tougher restrictions on recyclables because of large amounts of non-recyclable materials in customers' recycling bins. Recycling sorting facilities are asking for our help to clean up materials collected for recycling. Non-recyclable materials drive up costs associated with sorting these materials, which end up costing customers more money for recycling services. Help us to **Keep it Clean!**









DEBRIS BOXES

We offer 20, 30, and 40 cubic-yard drop boxes for your clean-up and remodeling projects. All construction and demolition boxes will need an asbestos survey.

RENT-A-TUB

We can deliver a temporary 300 gallon tub to your driveway that is the perfect size for a garage clean-up.



TRANSFER STATIONS

Cleaning up around the home or wanting to self-haul a load of your garbage? Whether it's a few bags or large contractor loads we can handle and help you properly dispose of your garbage. We have two clean and conveniently located transfer stations to serve you:

Recycle used motor oil, gasoline, antifreeze, tires, and appliances at the Transfer Station. Fees apply for some items, call for details.

ASBESTOS

Due to new requirements by Oregon DEQ regarding Asbestos Abatement, all incoming loads will now require asbestos paperwork. In order for us to accept or haul any construction or demolition debris we ask that you have an Asbestos Clearance Certification from a certified abatement company stating the material is asbestos free. By law, all commercial demolition debris must be certified asbestos free.

WOOD, YARD DEBRIS, & CONCRETE

These materials are accepted for a fee. Loads must be clean and free from trash. Please see an attendant for pricing.

PURCHASE OF SCRAP METAL

If you have less than 400 lbs. of metal, we accept it at no charge. If you have over 400 lbs, we will buy it from you at the current market rate. You will need a current government-issued PHOTO ID and must sign a declaration that the metal is not stolen. Items must be at least 95% metal. Please call ahead if you're bringing in cars, boats, or other vehicles. You will need to have the title and all fluids drained prior to arrival. Fees apply for appliances with refrigerants (do not attempt to remove the coolant on your own!).



HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE

The Lincoln County Solid Waste District and Lincoln County Haulers together put on an annual event in July where Lincoln County residents can drop off their Household Hazardous Waste at no charge. We will post on our website and Facebook page the date and time of that event. It can be a tough job determining which household products can be disposed of in your regular trash and what is considered hazardous. Here is a simplified list of Household Hazardous Waste:

Poisons: Pesticides, herbicides, fungicides, and other poisons

Heavy Metals: Products containing mercury

Corrosives: Acids, bases, and reactives

Not Accepted: Commercial waste, smoke detectors, chemo waste, ammunition, fireworks, road flares, gunpowder, and explosives.



ELECTRONICS

Oregon E-Cycles is a free recycling program for computers, TVs, laptops, monitors, DVD players, VCRs, cable boxes and game consoles. The program is funded by manufacturers, with oversight from Oregon DEQ. Drop off items at the Toledo or Waldport Transfer Stations. For large quantities, call ahead to make an appointment. TVs, computers, monitors, and laptops are prohibited from disposal in the trash or in the commingled recycling.



PAINT

You can drop off residential quantities of latex and oil-based paints at either of our transfer stations. Paint thinner, stripper, and other products are not accepted. All paint sold in Oregon includes a surcharge to fund a collection and recycling program. Visit PaintCare.org for details.

BILLING

Residential accounts are billed monthly in advance. Commercial and drop box accounts are billed monthly for the previous month. Bills are due upon receipt.

SET UP AUTO-PAY

We offer an automated payment system (ACH), that can deduct payments from your checking account. Please call our office to sign up for this program and we will send you an enrollment form.

ONLINE PAYMENT

You can pay your bill online by visiting our website, www.dahldisposalservice.com, and clicking on the "Pay Bill Online" icon at the top right of the home page. You will need your current bill handy to enter the necessary information.

CASH, CHECK OR CARD PAYMENTS

To make a payment in person by check or credit/debit card, please visit our office at 380 NW 1st St in Toledo (no cash accepted here). To make a cash payment, please visit one of our transfer station locations. You can also pay by mail using check or card. Please do not use cash to pay by mail!

MOBILE APP

We have an app! Use your smartphone to visit the app store and download the app. You can find out your service day and enroll in text reminders. You can see our service calendar and check if it is recycle or yard debris week. You also use our Waste Wizard, a database designed to help you figure out which things are recyclable and which are not. Our app also has a "You Call We Haul" request form so you can sign up to have bulky items hauled away (fees apply for this service).
